About the survey

Purpose: Assess the availability of evidence-based health promotion programs for older adults in Hawai'i and use the results for public policy advocacy.



How: The survey link was distributed to potential participants via emails and e-newsletters.


The survey asked, in 2023...

- List the evidence-based (EB) health promotion programs.



In 2023, 21 organizations offered health promotion programs for older adults and their caregivers.



Two-thirds (14 organizations) implemented ACL approved evidence-based health promotion programs.



Major challenges in offering and sustaining EB health promotion programs over time



In 2023, 12 organizations did not offer EB programs, but...

- 7 of them offered health promotion programs for older adults/caregivers.
 - Older adults (7)
 - Caregivers (6)
- 1 of them indicated high likelihood in offering evidence-based health promotion program in 2024.
 - Very likely (1)
 - Neither likely or unlikely (3)
 - Somewhat unlikely (1)
 - Very unlikely (3)
 - Unknown (4)
- 4 of them were interested in exploring collaboration opportunities.

 - Hawai'i Family Caregiver Coalition
 - Hoʻokele Caregivers Maui
 - Salvation Army Community Assistance Center
